
Browns Canyon ≈ Devils Canyon

Browns Canyon in Chatsworth (north San Fernando Valley) is an excellent jump-off point for trails through the **Santa Susanna mountains** and **Devils Canyon**.



- Directions: From the 118 Freeway in Chatsworth
- Exit De Soto Avenue
- Head North to Browns Canyon Road. Turn right
- The Park is about four miles up at 16100 Browns Canyon Road

Miles of newly improved trails lead over the mountains from **Browns Canyon** west towards **Devils Canyon**. A nice loop starts in an abandoned gravel quarry known as Gopher Canyon, progresses WESTWARD uphill into the newly acquired Michael D. Antonovich County Park, meanders NORTH for a while, then descends WESTWARD and down into **Devils**





Canyon, one of the last truly remaining unspoiled areas in the Northwest Valley. Devils Canyon is principally riparian habitat featuring oak and willow woodlands and a seasonal stream. After winding down (SOUTH) Devils Canyon a mile or two, the trail leaves the creekbed towards the EAST and ascends the mountain, then drops back down into Gopher Canyon where the loop started.

Total distance, approximately 8 miles, with frequent rest stops or slow going as the mountains can be very steep.

Recommended for intermediate to advanced riders, and well-conditioned horses.
